


# MURAL BIKE RACK PROGRAM

**WHAT**: 18 Functional bike racks adorned with murals by local artists installed around Atlanta area


WHEN: Installation will begin Nov. 16






#### FIVE BIKE RACKS WILL BE PLACED IN NPU M. PLEASE SEE LOCATIONS BELOW.

## 1. Fulton Co. Library, Forsyth and Williams Street Plaza




